This amendment is by and between the State of Minnesota, through its Commissioner of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry, 500 Lafayette Rd., St. Paul, MN 55155 ("State") and Wabasha Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD), 611 Broadway Ave., Ste. 10, Wabasha, MN 55981, ("Grantee").

#### Recitals

- 1. The State has a grant contract with the Grantee identified as SWIFT Contract Number 152295 ("Original Grant Contract") for the purpose of completing the project entitled: "Landscape Stewardship for Family Forestland Owners: Increasing Results through Integrated and Collaborative Service Delivery NIPF Pilot Phase 2", under the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Program, USDA Forest Service, CFDA #10.664, Federal Award # 15-DG-11420004-068, the State received a federal award of \$255,000.00 on May 7, 2015, of which was sub-awarded to the Grantee DUNS # 007666276. This project is not a research and development project.
- 2. This amendment provides the funds from the Minnesota Forest Resources Council Landscape Program to support the development of the project. These funds were designated as a state cash match at the inception of the project.
- 3. The State and the Grantee are willing to amend the Original Grant Contract as stated below.

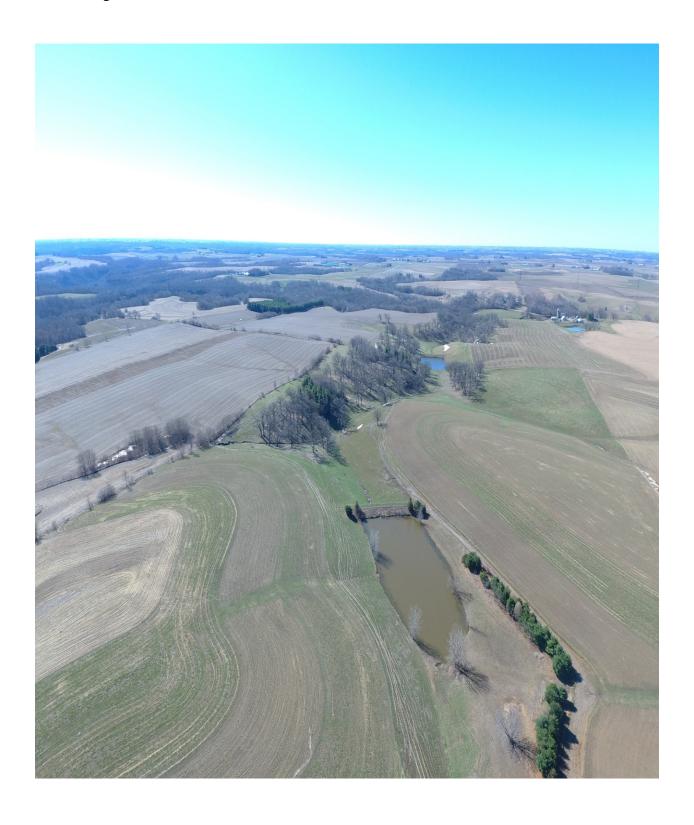

# 2019 Legislative Session Summary June 1, 2019

Final 2019 legislative action concluded on May 31, 2019 when Governor Walz signed thirteen budget bills into law. The Minnesota State Legislature passed those bills during a one-day special session a week earlier. Governor Walz shared, "At a time when politics is filled with chaos and division, Minnesota is showing the rest of the nation there's another way to govern, we can work together." The session concluded with positive advancements for conservation in Minnesota; BWSR's appropriations for the next biennium (fiscal years 2020 and 2021) and related policy are outlined below.

#### **General Fund**

The legislature appropriated BWSR's General Fund budget for fiscal years 2020 and 2021. It includes several grant programs (as shown at right), along with agency operations, easement stewardship, and wetland conservation act implementation.

The bill also included \$200K appropriated to the Environmental Quality Board (with BWSR leadership) to continue exploring the feasibility of the state assuming wetland permitting from the federal government (via Section 404 of the Clean Water Act).

#### **Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund** (Lottery proceeds)

BWSR will receive funding for one project:

**\$900,000 for Lawns to Legumes**: establishes a program for demonstration projects that provide grants or payments to plant residential lawns with native vegetation and pollinator-friendly forbs and legumes. The Board is required to establish criteria for this program that may award up to 75% of project costs, or 90% in areas where there is a high potential of presence for the rusty patched bumble bees (the official state bee). #### **Outdoor Heritage Fund (Legacy fund)**

BWSR will receive funding for three projects recommended by the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council:

\$937,000 for Wild Rice protection	to establish permanent conservation easements for native wild rice bed protection.
\$2,750,000 for Lower Wild Rice River habitat	for voluntary permanent conservation easements and to restore river and related habitat in the Wild Rice River corridor.
\$2,276,000 for RIM Reserve - Grasslands	to restore and enhance important grassland habitat via conservation easements.

#### **Clean Water Fund (Legacy fund)**

The fiscal year 20-21 biennium has approximately \$261 million available through the Clean Water Fund (CWF). BWSR will receive over \$138 million, with nearly 90% out to local governments for conservation implementation. These appropriations largely reflect the work of the Clean Water Council. The success of CWF efforts focus on a highly integrated and collaborative system for water resource management, including a holistic approach to managing surface water and groundwater; and comprehensive planning that supports local implementation.

# SWCD Capacity Funding Status: the use of CWF continues.

While there was strong acknowledgement that a consistent funding source is needed for SWCDs, the legislature did not act on proposed general funds, local tax levy authority, or fund through an increase in solid waste fees.

As a result, the SWCDs will continue to be funded through the Clean Water Fund during this biennium (at \$24M).

The formula for distributing these funds includes each SWCD receiving \$100,000 per year. The remaining funds will be distributed based on county allocations, the amount of private lands, and the amount of public waters.

#### **Policy Items**

Several policy provisions related to the work of BWSR and our local government partners were signed into law this session:

**SWCD Duties** – codifies and clarifies the duties of soil and water conservation districts. The language also lists a number of services provided by SWCDs in carrying out the duties, including providing technical expertise, providing information and outreach, and administering projects and programs (found in MN Statute Chapter 103C.332).

**Coordinated Water Management** – updates and aligns the state's Clean Water Legacy Act (chapter 114D) with the state's Water Planning and Implementation Chapter (chapter 103B) to:

- Increase the Pace of Progress
- Align and use plans and reports
- o Provide flexibility and support local action
- Better Link Surface and Ground water

Compensation - increases daily compensation cap for watershed district managers from \$75 to \$125.

**Wetland Banking Fees** - requires wetland banking fees to be based on the actual cost to BWSR of implementing associated activities (BWSR already does this, so it will not change current practice).

**Wetland replacement; frameworks for in-lieu fee program** - allows BWSR to complete planning frameworks and other application requirements for federal approval of an in-lieu fee program for wetland replacement. Since we were not appropriated any resources, for now, we will not pursue in the manner the language suggests.

**Animal Units** - increases in the size of feedlots eligible for the Feedlot Water Quality Cost-sharing program. Changing from under 300 animal units to under 500 animal units better matches feedlot permitting thresholds in other programs.

#### **Drainage**

The Governor signed this bill into law in mid-May. Developed via recommendations made by the Drainage Work Group, the bill accomplishes three main elements that:

- Clarify and streamline the Ag BMP Loan Program to better enable low interest loan "projects" involving multiple landowners and their Chapter 103E drainage authority.
- Clarify and streamline three applicable sections of Chapter 103E involving incremental buffer strips, drainage system legal counsel, and redetermination of benefits and damages.
- Add a voluntary, alternative method for Chapter 103E drainage system repair cost apportionment that better utilizes technology to more equitably apportion repair costs, based on relative runoff and sediment contributions to the system.

- 6. This contract, when approved by the organization board or council, will remain in effect unless canceled or amended by mutual agreement, except where installations of practices covered by this contract have not been installed by , this contract will be automatically terminated on that date.
- 7. Items of cost for which reimbursement is claimed are to be supported by invoices/receipts for payments and will be verified by the organization board as practical and reasonable. The invoices must include the name of the vendor; materials, labor or equipment used; the component unit costs and the dates the work was performed. The organization board has the authority to make adjustments to the costs submitted for reimbursement.
